Application for Texas Title and/or Registration

General Instructions

With a few exceptions, you are entitled to be informed about the information the department collects about you. The Texas Government Code entitles you to receive and review the information and to request that the department correct any information about you that is incorrect. Please contact the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles at 1-888-368-4689 or 512-465-3000 for details.

This form must be completed and submitted to your county tax assessor-collector accompanied by any required application fee, supporting documents, registration fee, if applicable, and any motor vehicle tax due. An application form may be reproduced or faxed. A completed form must contain the original signature of the buyer. The seller's signature may be reproduced or faxed. All title applications must include one of the government-issued photo IDs listed in Box 15. Detailed instructions for completing this form are located in the *Detailed Instructions for Application for Texas Title and/or Registration* (Form VTR-130-UIF).

Additional Details

Title Only: License plates and registration insignia previously issued for this motor vehicle must be surrendered in accordance with Transportation Code §501.0275, if applicable, unless this vehicle displays a license plate under an applicable status of forces agreement. The following types of vehicles are not eligible for Title Only: construction machinery (unconventional vehicles), water well drilling units, machinery used exclusively for drilling water wells, construction machinery not designed to transport persons or property, implements of husbandry, farm equipment (including combines), golf carts, slow moving vehicles, or any vehicle with a suspended or revoked title.

Registration Purposes Only: Do not surrender an original out of state title with this application. A Texas title will NOT be issued for a vehicle applying for Registration Purposes Only. The receipt issued upon filing this application will serve as the registration receipt and proof of application for Registration Purposes Only.

- **Foreign Vehicles:** Foreign vehicles applying for Registration Purposes Only must attach DOT Form HS-7 or U.S. Customs Form CF-7501 to indicate the vehicle is: 1) over 25 years old, or 2) complies with Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standards, or 3) is being imported in the United States for a temporary period by a nonresident or a member of the armed forces of a foreign country on assignment in the U.S., and does not conform to the Federal Motor Vehicle Standards and cannot be sold in the U.S.

Nontitle Registration: Certain trailers, farm equipment, construction machinery, oil well servicing machinery, water well drilling units, etc. are either exempt from, or not eligible for title, but are eligible for, or required to, obtain registration or a specialty plate in order to operate on the highway. Applicants should mark this box only when applicable. **Note:** A lien cannot be recorded on this type of application.

Out of State Vehicles: If the applicant certifies the vehicle is located out of state, self-certification of the Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) is allowed if a VIN verification form issued by a Texas state-approved safety inspection station is not included with the submission of this application. See *Vehicle Identification Number Certification* (Form VTR-270) for more information.

Notice

- The sales and use tax must be paid to the county tax assessor-collector within 30 days from the date of purchase or entry of the vehicle into Texas.
- A \$2.50 transfer fee is paid to transfer current registration to the new owner in addition to the title application fee and other applicable fees. If the registration is not current, full registration fees are due unless applying for Title Only.
- A 6.25 percent motor vehicle sales and use tax is imposed on the sales price (less trade-in allowance) of motor vehicles for use in Texas or a motor vehicle purchased outside of the state and later brought into this state by a Texas resident.
- Standard Presumptive Value (SPV) applies to private-party sales of most used motor vehicles purchased or brought into Texas. The tax is computed on the greater of the sales price or 80 percent of the SPV on the day of title application.
- New Texas residents are subject to a \$90 use tax on a vehicle brought into this state that was previously registered to the new resident in another state or foreign country. This is in lieu of the 6.25 percent use tax imposed on a Texas resident.
- A \$10 gift tax is due when a person receives a motor vehicle as a gift from an immediate family member, guardian, or a decedent's estate. A vehicle donated to, or given by, a non-profit service organization qualifying under IRC 501(c)(3) is also taxed as a gift. Both donor and recipient must sign the Comptroller's joint affidavit, *Affidavit of Motor Vehicle Gift Transfer* (Form 14-317). The affidavit and the title application must be submitted in person by either the donor or recipient.
- A transaction in which a motor vehicle is transferred to another person without payment of consideration and one that does not qualify as a gift described above is a sale and will be subject to tax calculated on the vehicle's standard presumptive value.
- A late penalty equal to 5 percent of the tax will be charged if the tax or surcharge is paid from 1 to 30 calendar days late. If more than 30 calendar days late, the penalty will be 10 percent of the tax; minimum penalty is \$1.
- In addition to the late tax payment penalty, Texas Transportation Code provides for an escalating delinquent transfer penalty of up to \$250 for failure to apply for title within 30 days from the date of title assignment. Submit this application along with proper evidence of ownership and appropriate valid proof of financial responsibility such as a liability insurance card or policy.
- All new residents applying for a Texas title and registration for a motor vehicle must file at the county tax assessor-collector of the county in Texas where the applicant resides within 30 days of establishing residency. Texas law requires that all vehicles previously registered and titled or registered in another state or country be inspected for safety and the vehicle identification number verified before such vehicles may be registered in Texas. These inspections must be made by a state appointed safety inspection station that will complete a Texas Vehicle Inspection Report. This form must be submitted to the county tax assessor-collector with your application for registration and Texas title.

Trailer Verification Statement of Fact

Trailer Definitions

Full Trailer

- Designed or used to carry its load wholly on its own structure and is drawn or designed to be drawn by a motor vehicle.

Semitrailer

- Designed or used with a motor vehicle, so part of the weight of the semitrailer and its load rests on or is carried by the motor vehicle drawing the semitrailer.

Travel Trailer

- Not designed or used primarily as a permanent dwelling, but as temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, travel, or seasonal use;
- Built on a single chassis; and
- Must be less than eight (8) feet, six (6) inches in width or less than forty-five (45) feet in length (not including the hitch).

Park Model Trailer

- Not designed for use or primarily used as a permanent dwelling, but as temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, travel, or seasonal use;
- Built on a single chassis;
- Permanently towable by a light duty truck; and
- Eight (8) feet, six (6) inches or greater in width and forty-five (45) feet or greater in length, but 400 square feet or less when measured at the largest horizontal projections.

Note: Manufactured homes designed as a permanent dwelling may not be titled and registered as a travel trailer or park model trailer. Custom trailers with living quarters primarily used for commercial purposes must be titled and registered as a full trailer or semitrailer (including those with farm registration).

Permit Required to Move on Public Highways

Any trailer in excess of eight (8) feet, six (6) inches in width or fourteen (14) feet in height is required to be issued an oversize/overweight permit in addition to regular registration to legally move the trailer on a Texas public highway.

Additionally, a semitrailer exceeding fifty-nine (59) feet, a park model exceeding forty-five (45) feet, and most combinations of a pulling unit and trailer exceeding sixty-five (65) feet in length are required to be issued an oversize/overweight permit (in addition to regular registration) to legally move the trailer on a Texas public highway.

Last Titled and Registered Out of State

Any trailer last titled and registered out of state is required to pass a Texas vehicle safety inspection if the gross weight exceeds 7,500 lbs. before it may be titled and/or registered in Texas.

Any trailer that will not be used on a public highway is not subject to the Texas vehicle safety inspection requirements, and the applicant is required to certify the travel trailer or the park model trailer will not be operated on Texas public highways (and is applying for a Title Only) by marking the second box in the "Certification" section on page 1.

Applicants are also required to physically inspect the vehicle to verify the correct vehicle identification number.

A Title Only transaction is also permissible for a full trailer or semitrailer. The vehicle identification number can be self-certified by marking the second box in the "Certification" section on page 1 or by completing the *Vehicle Identification Number Certification* (Form VTR-270).

Weights on New or Out of State Trailers

The empty weight or shipping weight reflected on the evidence of ownership (i.e., manufacturer's certificate of origin or out of state title) is considered the empty weight. A weight certificate is required if the required weight information is not located on the manufacturer's certificate of origin or out of state title.



Rebuilt Vehicle Statement

Instructions

This form is required when a vehicle is repaired, rebuilt, reconstructed, or assembled in order to obtain a Texas title. The completed form must be submitted to a county tax assessor-collector with the *Application for Texas Title and/or Registration (Form 130-U)*, ownership evidence, and any other required documents. **Note: Page 2 must be completed if component parts were used to repair, rebuild, reconstruct, or assemble the vehicle. The owner and rebuilder may be the same; therefore, the same individual may sign both statements.**

An authorized Texas Department of Public Safety state vehicle inspection station must inspect the vehicle after it has been repaired, rebuilt, reconstructed, or assembled. Upon completion, the inspection station will provide a *Vehicle Inspection Report (VIR)*. A copy of the VIR may be required if the inspection cannot be automatically verified at the time of application for Texas title and registration. A vehicle safety inspection is not required if the vehicle will not be registered (Title Only) or is otherwise exempt from an inspection. **Note: An additional inspection is also required for any newly assembled vehicle that has not previously been titled as a complete vehicle. This additional inspection is completed on the Form VTR-64 (or Form VTR-852, if applicable).**

Part 1: Requirements for Obtaining a Notice of Determination for a Bonded Title

Complete page 1 of this form and submit the following to a TxDMV Regional Service Center:

- Both pages of this form, *Bonded Title Application or Tax Collector Hearing Statement of Fact* (VTR-130-SOF).
- The \$15.00 non-refundable processing fee in the form of cash, check, or money order. **Do not mail cash.**
- Any evidence of ownership (such as a title, bill of sale, or canceled check) and any other available documentation.
- The following additional documents, if applicable:
 - Rebuilt Vehicle Statement* (Form VTR-61) if the vehicle is a salvage vehicle that has been repaired, rebuilt, or reconstructed or if the vehicle is newly assembled.
 - ASE inspection on Form VTR-64 or VTR-852 if the vehicle is newly assembled.
- If the vehicle does not have a Texas record, a vehicle identification number inspection completed by law enforcement on Form VTR-68-A is required.
- If mailing this application to a TxDMV Regional Service Center, an email or phone number must be provided.

Each person signing this form must provide a copy of current government issued photo identification (ID). An ID that is expired not more than 12 months is considered current. An agent of the applicant must provide 1) a letter of signature authority on letterhead, printed business card, or an employee identification (all may be copies) and 2) a copy of their current government issued photo ID.

You may be required to leave this application and any additional documentation for processing.

Determining the Value of a Vehicle

Vehicle value is determined by the department using the Standard Presumptive Value (SPV) calculator found on the department's website at www.TxDMV.gov. If the SPV calculator does not return a value, the department will use a value from a national reference guide. If the department is unable to determine a value, you must obtain an appraisal from a licensed dealer or licensed insurance adjuster on a *Motor Vehicle Appraisal for Tax Collector Hearing / Bonded Title* (Form VTR-125). The appraisal must be legible, include the appraiser's business name, address, and license number; and must have the appraiser's original signature. **Contact your local TxDMV Regional Service Center or visit our website at www.TxDMV.gov for additional information.**

Part 2: Filing an Application for Texas Title and/or Registration

After this form is processed by a TxDMV Regional Service Center, the following must be submitted to your county tax assessor-collector's office for the bonded title to be processed or for the tax assessor-collector hearing to be held:

- Application for Texas Title and/or Registration* (Form 130-U).
- Both pages of this form, *Bonded Title Application or Tax Collector Hearing Statement of Fact* (VTR-130-SOF).
- Notice of Determination for a Bonded Title or Tax Assessor-Collector Hearing* (Form VTR-130-ND) issued by the TxDMV Regional Service Center with all enclosures attached (all documentation submitted to the TxDMV Regional Service Center in Part 1).
- If proceeding with a bonded title, the original bond (VTR-130-SB) purchased from the surety company (and the accompanying power of attorney, if applicable).
- Any evidence of ownership (such as a title, bill of sale, or canceled check) and any other available documentation.
- If applying for registration:
 - Vehicle Inspection Report issued by a Texas vehicle safety inspection station or
 - Vehicle Identification Number Certification* (Form VTR-270) if a certification option on the form applies.
- Proof of financial responsibility (liability insurance) in the applicant's name if applying for registration.
- Acceptable government issued photo ID (such as a driver license, ID card, or U.S. or foreign passport).
- A certified weight certificate for any out of state commercial vehicle or any vehicle whose weight cannot be determined.
